

# Ever thought about becoming an Umpire or Marker?



The English Umpires Association is very keen to encourage more of you to become markers and umpires. I was approached by Bernie Hill from the association who explained they are very keen to be more inclusive and encourage people to consider becoming markers and eventually umpires.

The EBUA runs courses to explain the roles to you, these are interactive and fun and it is worth checking their website to see when the next one near you is taking place.

On these courses you learn how a good marker can make a game and a bad one ruin it, and the importance of the role is explained.

- You will learn the basic laws of the sport
- The correct use of markers equipment with a series of on the green exercises
- Interactive tips and tricks for practical marking and time management



If you enjoy marking at local level there maybe opportunities to take part in other national events. If you enjoy marking you may want to consider becoming an umpire, like our very own Steve Alway who is a DBE member and was the Bowls England Umpire of the year .Steve was busy at Learnington during the Aviva National Finals where he worked on a number of days.

Also recently qualified as a marker and taking part during the national finals was DBE member and Munro Cup representative Harry Atkin.
